

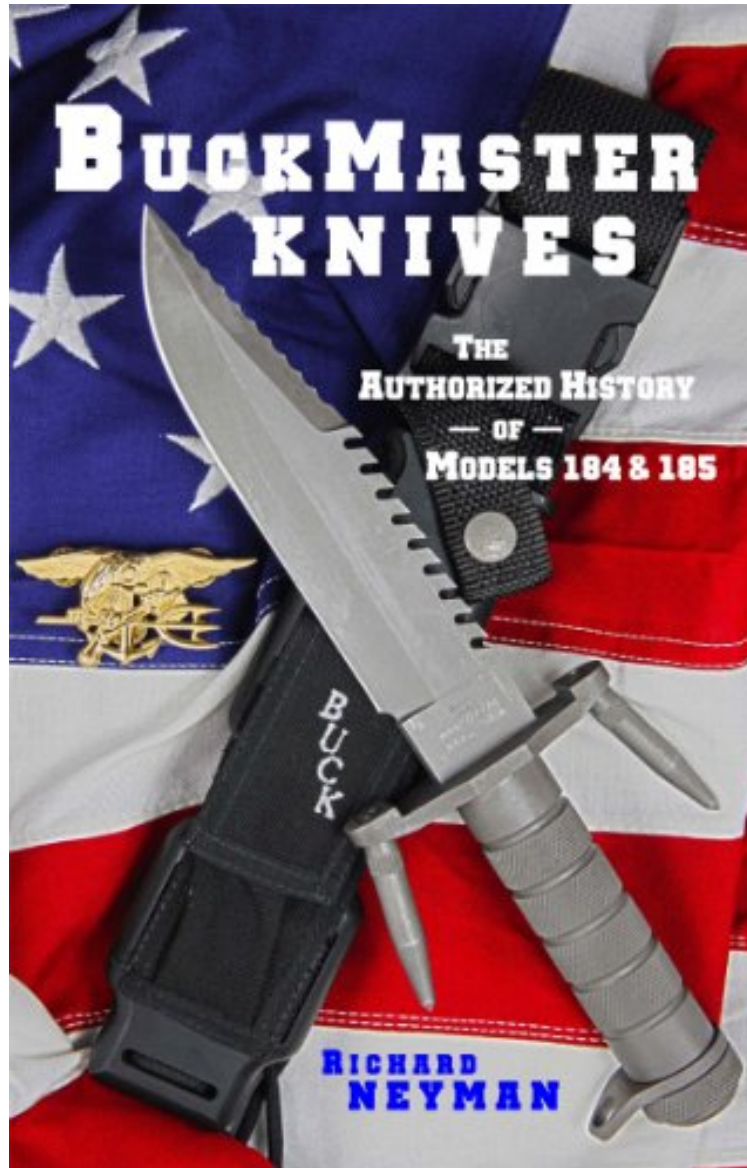

The BuckMaster survival knife was conceptualized, designed and built specifically for Navy SEAL Teams Six and Three in the 1980s.
