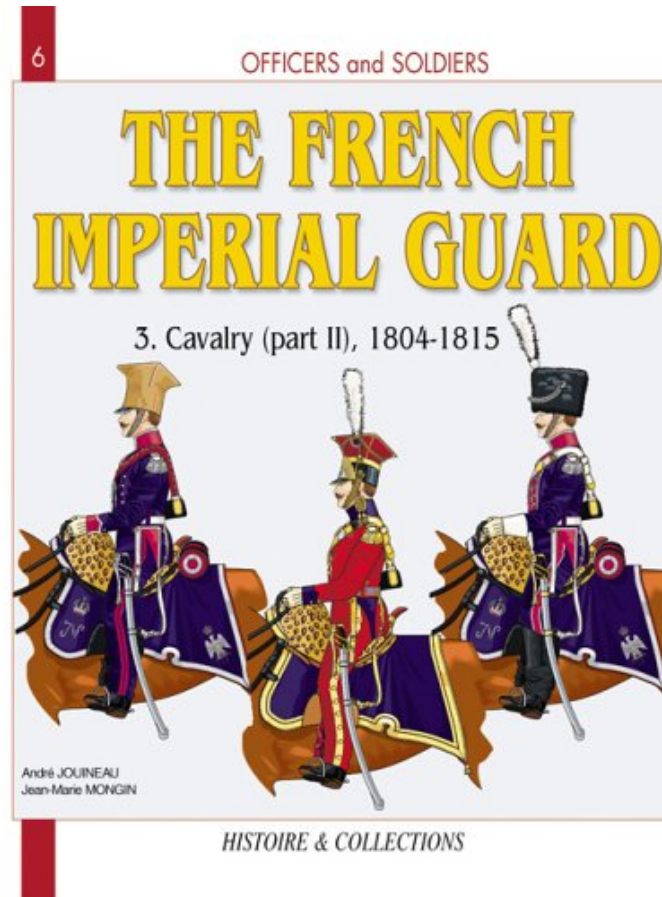

Jean-Marie Mongin has done a superb job with the text but the most striking feature of the work are the beautifully rendered illustrations of the hussar regimental uniforms. In their style and purpose they are perhaps the best I've encountered. French and details uniform information and organization. This volume includes information on the Mamelukes, Polish Lancers, Dutch lancers, 3rd Lancers, Berg lancers, and Gendarmerie D'Elite. Each unit has uniform information, full dress and campaign variations through the years, NCO and officer detail, trumpeters and kettle drummers, arms and equipment, saddles and flags and banners. The author/artist has done considerable research into various uniform sources and distilled the information here. Variations are also charted. Collectively, these books form a most impressive documentation on the Napoleonic Guard Cavalry.

The third volume in this successful series detailing the elite phalanx of Emperor Napoleon, puts an end to the study of the Guard cavalry. The troops depicted in Vol. 3 are the Mamelucks in their oriental dress, the famous Polish lancers, the red lancers (Dutch) and the guards of honor. (A fourth and last volume will subsequently describe the other mounted troops of the Imperial Guard : horse artillery, supply train and gendarmerie).

About the Author Since the seventies, Andre Jouineau has dedicated himself to studies in history and uniforms. Regular contributor to various magazines, he was appointed official painter of the Army in 1985 (title kept until 1994). Then, in the mid-nineties, he tackled computer illustration, which allowed "creating" a new uniformology genus.
