I went on to buy a number of FROG kits as the company did release my favourites in different versions and alternative markings, etc. That was forty years ago. FROG closed down operations at the end of the 1970's and some of their kits have lived on being released by other companies that bought their moulds. Reading through this book brought back a great deal of nostalgia and memories of those carefree days, of course being a young bloke, I was just interested in buying, building and painting them; however this book also covers how the company came to be and how it evolved over the years, sadly like many of the great model kit companies of the 1960's-1970's this company closed down as the model kit market changed and went through various ups and downs as the 1970's closed out. This book has been extensively researched and is a credit to the author's dedication in finding out the last possible piece of information on this notable model kit company and its products. The book abounds with a vast array of colour and black and white photographs of the company's kit line and detailed information on the transition in

packaging styles and kits being introduced, withdrawn, revised and those kits proposed for release but never quite making it. If you ever built a FROG model and remember looking through all those boxes, trying to decide what kit you wanted this time around, this book is for you.
