

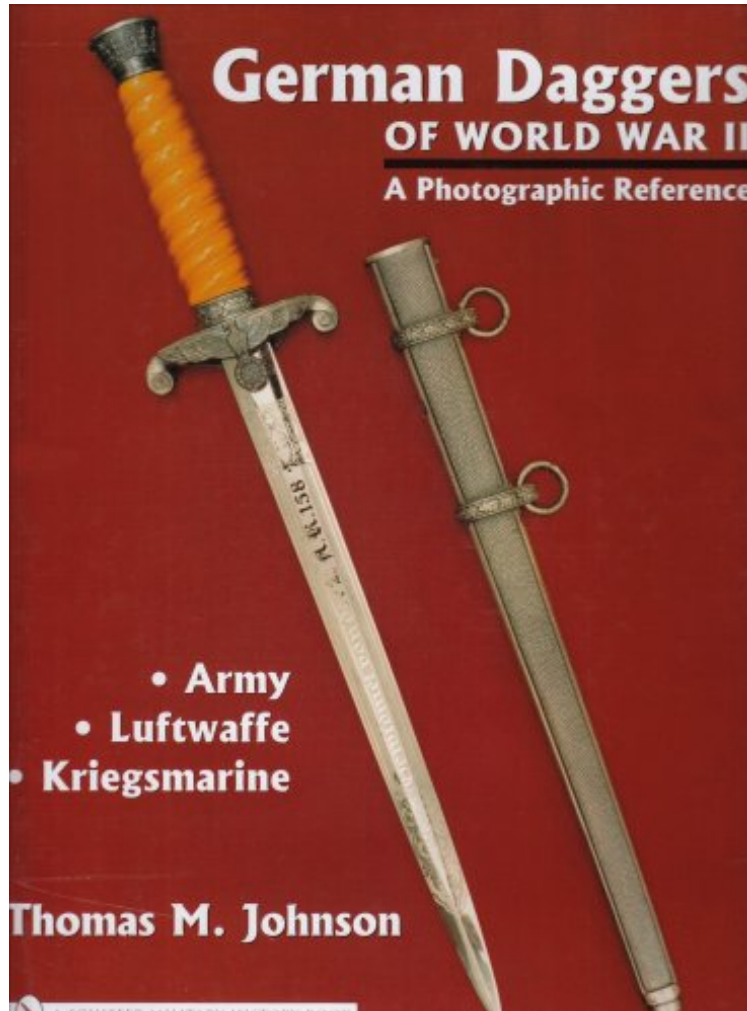

Also, you get pictures of stuff the normal collector won't usually see (so go to a museum) in real life and to me this is like having a book on house painting, and showing

pictures of the Sistine Chapel..A total waste.Truly this book is useless for the novice collector and totally useless for the advanced collector. This gentleman is an expert and collector of German WWII daggers and other items. These books provide excellent photos of daggers from the different military and paramilitary groups in Germany during WWII, and there are many historical photos that show the dagger awards and presentation. These books contain many black and white and color photos with an excellent attention to detail. There are many daggers in these books that the average collector like myself could not afford because of the rarity of the item and who receiver the dagger. I do highly recommend this set of books for the dagger collector and WWII militaria buff.
