This book is a catch 22 By Jessica_jfk If you are new to bisque doll collecting and are looking for books to help you begin making sense of it all, this is not the book or even one of the first dozen books on the subject to buy. It is a bit like giving someone who can't spell a dictionary to learn English. There are no explanations about the marks themselves. It is purely a list of all marks with page upon page of symbols with no help in wading through it. I am sure the advanced collector loves having this book to verify the identity of their newest addition, but for the beginning collector, this book is useless. A more useful book is All-Bisque and Half-Bisque dolls by Angione. For how old this book is, the reading is fascinating. Even though the focus of the two books is somewhat different, Angione helps create a foundation upon which you can build and her accompanying photos make it easy to get a sense of what she is saying. This book is void of any of that. The catch 22 is, only advanced collectors will appreciate this resource book and they don't need it.
