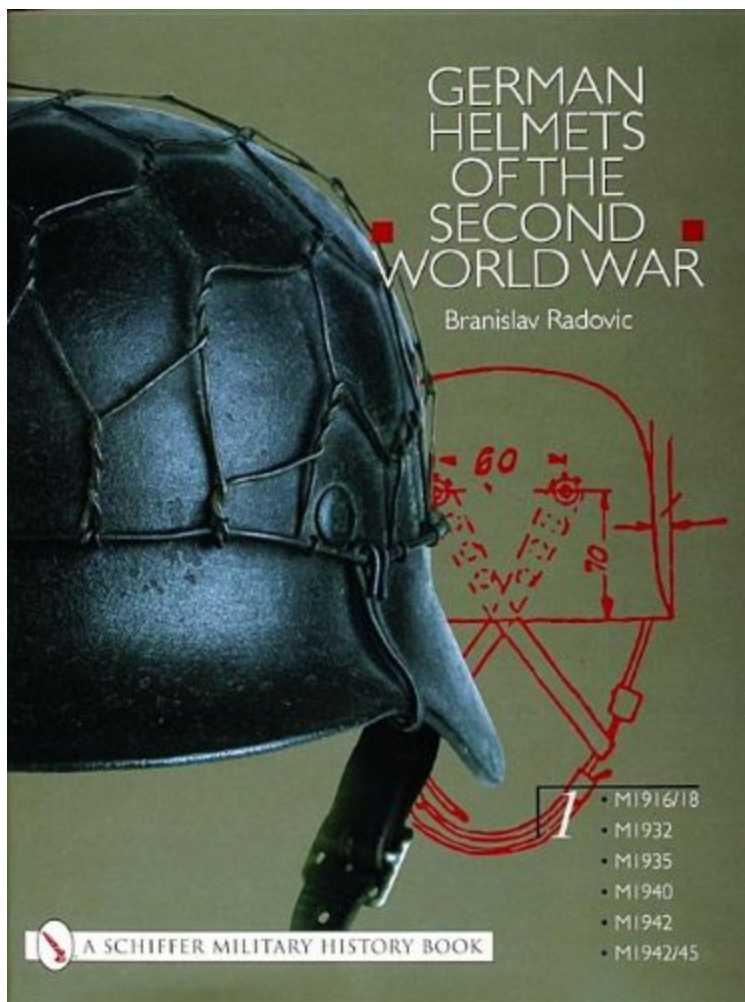

It shows great detail of the many types of original German helmets covered in a very large format. On my book shelf it plays just a small part and is a welcome addition to other books on this subject that any modern collector should arm themselves with.

This two volume set is a fully illustrated, detailed look at the famous German "stahlhelm" of World War II. Full color photographs - including multiple-view, interiors, and up-close detail - show Army, Luftwaffe, Kriegsmarine, Waffen-SS, Paratroop, and many others. Both volumes have been specifically produced to give the advanced collector the opportunity to expand his or her knowledge, and to compare paint and insignia against their own collections.
