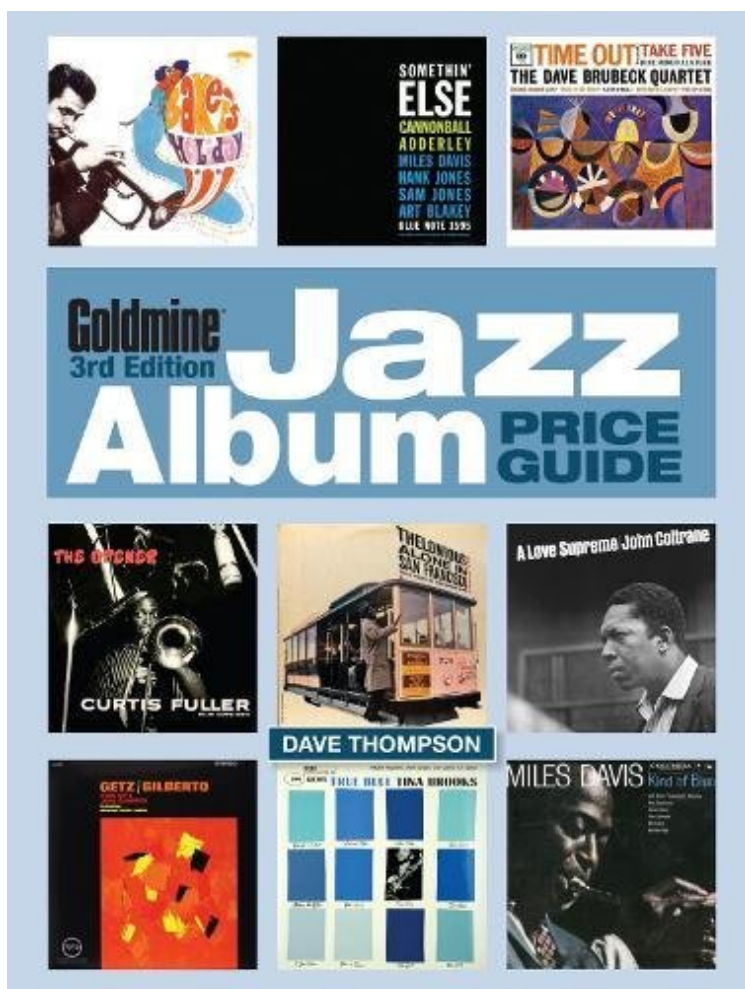

Don't throw away your 2nd edition!By Theo MilesI just received the 3rd edition, and while there are some nice updates and price corrections, there are also a number of important entries missing. I looked for Introducing Johnny Griffin on Blue Note, 1st pressing, Lexington Avenue: missing. Coltrane's Giant Steps on Atlantic, black label mono original: missing. Ken McIntyre, Looking Ahead with Eric Dolphy, New Jazz purple label: missing. These were the first three records I looked up! How about Tina Brooks True Blue, mono original on Blue Note? That one seems to be missing as well. There are also many entries with not enough information to ascertain an original copy. For example, Coltrane on Prestige 7105: there is no distinction between 50th St and Bergenfield addresses. They're not both worth \$1200! It's good to have another reference, but the older editions, especially those by Neal Umphred are still the go-to publications.0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
