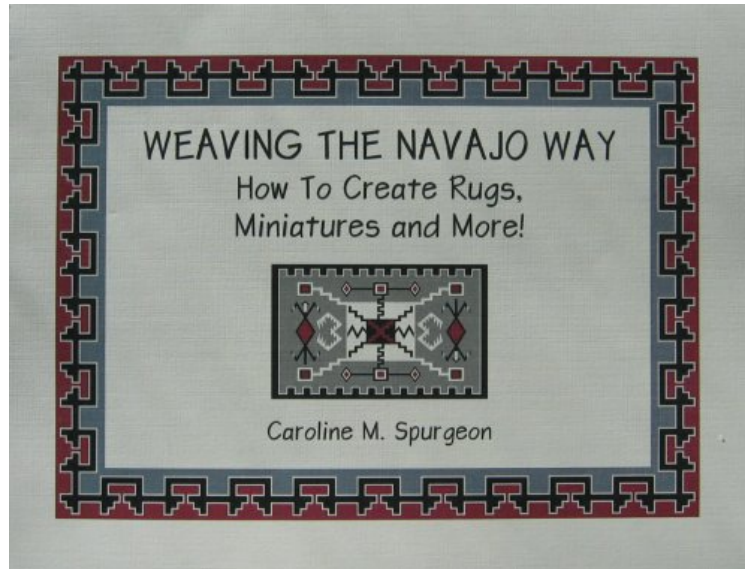

There are graphics of the various (how/to) steps in weaving in particular steps...such as adding new yarn, how to make the various stitches and so much more. Good examples of how to warp your loom and even how to make your own Navajo style loom, and much, much more. I really like that the book has the 'spiral binding' the book can lay flat with closing on itself. I was so enthused about Caroline's looms that I ordered her 'Table Loom' which is the largest loom she makes and will allow me to weave an 18" x 24" rug or wall hanging. You do not need the loom that is featured in the book.
