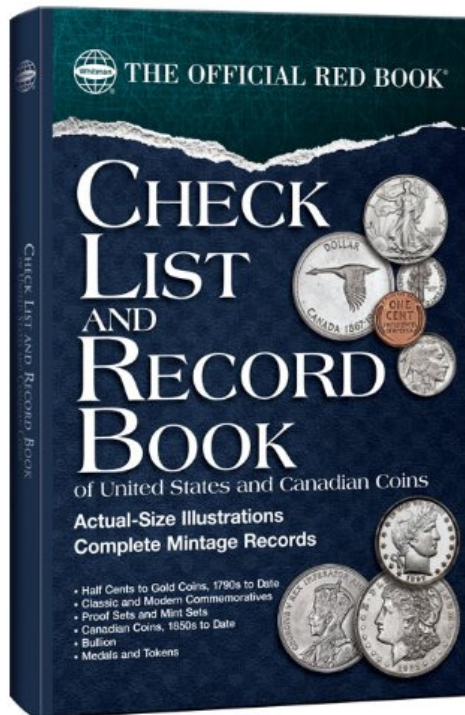

A good idea but in dire need of some editorial "upgrades." Here's what needs to be fixed to make it worthy of more than a three star rating:
1) While the book provides a checklist for each coin in various conditions, the grades listed are incomplete and inconsistent with the grades shown in the red book. For example, the Red Book grades Standing Liberty 25c and Buffalo nickels down to "good", but the checklist only goes down to very good. Got a Barber half dollar in good condition? Good luck trying to figure out where to "check it" off, because the checklist only goes down to VG. Have an MS-64 or MS-65 Morgan Dollar? TOO BAD, because there's NO BOX for that! Only MS-60 and MS-63. Got an MS-63 St Guaden's \$20? SORRY, you'll not find a grade box for that either. Frustrating! There ARE "good" boxes for the early 1850's and older coins, but come on, who doesn't have "good" condition Barber or Liberty Seated age coins? Obviously, you don't need a "good" box for a 2012 Lincoln cent, but at LEAST BE CONSISTENT WITH ALL THE GRADES DENOTED IN THE RED BOOK FOR EACH COIN TYPE.
2) Ditto for Canadian coins grading. In that section you'll only find the old-fashioned vague, VG, F, VF, AU, UNC, PF grades. There are a few Victorian era coins with "good" boxes.
3) Canadian Commemorative issues section is woefully incomplete. I've already found several

coins that are "missing" from the list.4) NO listings at all for Canadian bullion coins--including the Commemorative Maple Leaf issues,5) NO listings at all for Canadian Uncirculated, Proof, Speciman or other sets.It IS a good way to keep track on paper (except for what's not in the book!) and does have a place for notes on each item line (you paid HOW MUCH???). A minor tweak would be alternating shaded/unshaded lines to make all those charts flow easier on the eye so you don't slap an X in the wrong box.As is, the book is usable, but it is FLAWED. Needs some editing and improvement to rate more than THREE STARS. I made it work, but I was disappointed in that somebody at Whitman's hadn't thought this book through better before printing it!0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
