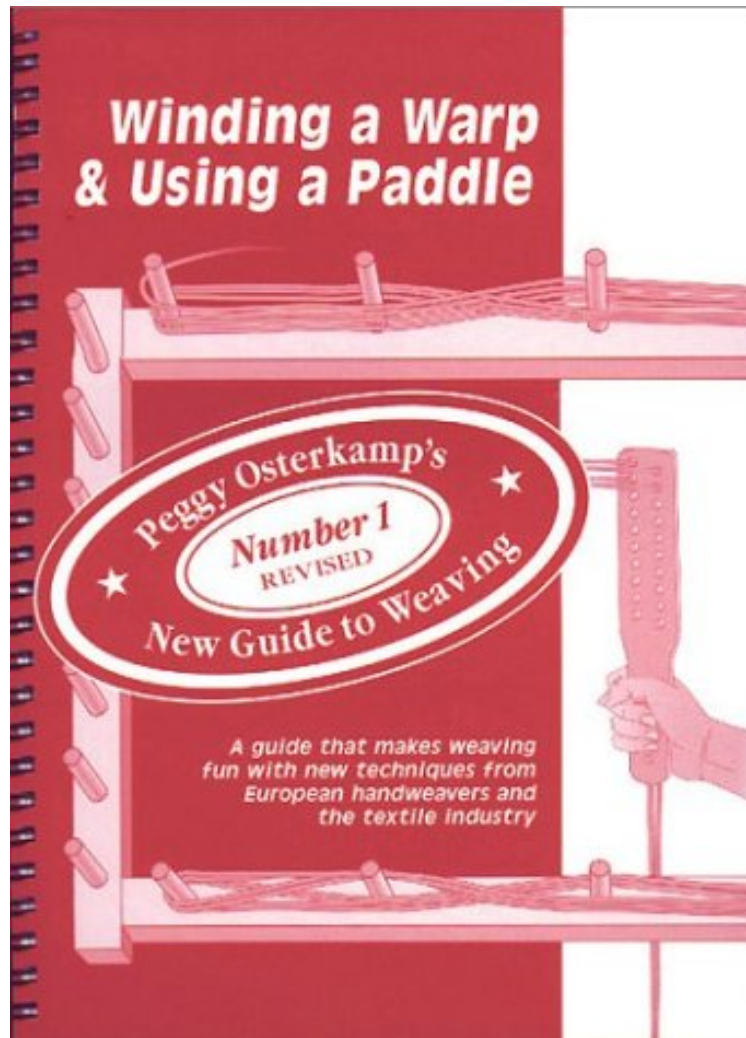

New Guide to Weaving By Bernie (xyzyzy) This is a very comprehensive guide to warping. It starts out with the get off the ground description of what a loom is and the names of the parts in the chapter on weaving basics. Then we get into warping boards and warping mills, along with other equipment that may be best to get along with the new loom, in the chapter on equipment. We learn the finer points and hope you do not get scared at the complexity of the warping board use, and the reason for a guide string in the chapter on your warp's path. The advantage in reading this before trying any warping is best shown in example figure 59 and 60 under the chapter on raddle groups; it shows how to avoid much of the selvage breakage. Only thing missing from the several warping methods is The "Nyquist Tie-on" method. Well I do not want to paraphrase the whole book but take note that the appendix alone is useful for charts and formulas. On the inside back cover is a Reed Substitute Chart that can save a lot of money and time while you are acquiring your extensive read collection. The spiral binding adds to the usefulness of the book as you can set it down while following the figures. This book is well worth the cost and can add greatly to your skill and fun of the craft. This first book in the series guides you through every step of planning a project and measuring the warp threads. You will learn how to prepare your loom for weaving -- beginning at the back of the loom. You will learn how to beam on, thread, and sley the reed. You'll find chapters on sectional beaming, tying on new warps, knots, and adjusting jack, counterbalance and countermark looms. There are step-by-step sections at the ends of chapters for quick reference at the loom, after you have read the full-length instructions. There are many illustrations so that the parts of the loom can be clearly seen.
